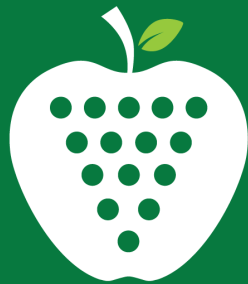

PLEASE NOTE:

Cider in competitive classes must be manufactured using apples grown in the UK.

All Cider entries must conform to HMRC Notice 162 although it is not necessary for the hobbyist to be registered.

All first prize winners are to be eligible to be judged for the Royal Cornwall Show, Cornwall Farmhouse Cider Championship or Royal Cornwall Show, Cornwall Open Championship and will thereafter be eligible to use the special logo on their appropriate cider and any publicity. The RCAA will also give appropriate publicity.

The appropriate logo will be supplied to the relevant prize winners and Champions by the RCAA.



FARMHOUSE CIDER CLASSES – still cider only.

For classes 1, 2, 3 AND 4 entries should be shown in a 1 gallon or 5 litre flagon/demijohn, and be bunged not screwed.

For guidance, the following specific gravity will be used, Dry up to 1.008, Medium from 1.008 to 1.015, Sweet from 1.015 and above.

A label will be supplied to be tied on.

- Class 1 DRY FARMHOUSE**
- Class 2 MEDIUM FARMHOUSE**
- Class 3 SWEET FARMHOUSE**
- Class 4 HOBBYIST CIDER MAKERS – Please state dry, medium or sweet on entry form (Hobbyists are cider makers who do not sell their cider)**

OPEN CIDER CLASSES

For classes 5, 6, 7 and 8 (Fruit Cider) entries should be shown in 500ml ale bottles. Cider makers should send two bottles per entry. Carbonation is permitted.

Commercial labelling is permitted on one bottle only, the other is to be labelled with a **competition label only** (to be supplied to the exhibitor).

For guidance, the following specific gravity will be used, Dry up to 1.008, Medium from 1.008 to 1.015, Sweet from 1.015 and above.

- Class 5 DRY**
- Class 6 MEDIUM**
- Class 7 SWEET**

FRUIT CIDER

We have defined a fruit cider as a flavoured cider in the range of 3% - 5.7%ABV, the alcohol to be derived from the fermentation of apple juice.

Two 500ml bottles per entry, one commercially labelled for display, one labelled only with the competition label provided.

- Class 8 FRUIT CIDER**

PASTEURISED APPLE JUICE

For Class 11, entries should be shown in 750ml screw cap bottles. Apple Juice exhibitors should send two bottles per entry.

Commercial labelling is permitted on one bottle only, the other is to be labelled with a competition label (to be supplied to the exhibitor). The apple variety /varieties to be stated on the label.

- Class 9 ANY APPLE JUICE**

Entries may be delivered by hand to the Cornwall Cider Championship marquee on Wednesday 8th June between 11am and 4pm.

Entries must be labelled before delivery with the labels supplied, where appropriate.

SECURITY

Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

ENTRY FEES

The entry fee is £5 per entry.

An exhibitor paying entry fees amounting to £20 or more will be eligible to receive an exhibitor's one day ticket.

PRIZES

All classes are eligible for Gold, Silver and Bronze prize cards.

In addition there will be prize cards for the Championship winners.

There are no monetary prizes.

There is a Special Prize of £100 voucher for the best cider exhibited by a hobbyist generously given by Vigo Presses Ltd.

There is a Perpetual Cup for the Champion Cider.(Best Cider in show). Kindly donated by Vigo Presses Ltd.

There is a Special Prize of a Perpetual Shield for the best cider exhibited by a hobbyist (made by Mr John Ham and generously given by Trevor's Farmhouse Cider).

HOW TO ENTER

Either download an entry form from www.royalcornwallshow.org/competitors or complete the enclosed form and send it together with your entry fee to **Tom Bray, Haywood Farm, St Mabyn, Bodmin PL30 3BU** to arrive no later than Friday 31st May.

Cheques should be payable to 'Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association' (Please do not abbreviate).

No entries will be accepted after the entry closing date.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

After the close of entries you will be sent a pack containing the following

- Exhibitors letter giving full details of when and where to deliver your exhibit(s)
- Exhibitors day ticket if your entry fee amounts to £20 or over
- Any additional day tickets if purchased when entering

THEN

Exhibit labels will be sent following close of entries and these are to be attached by the exhibitor to bottles or flagons / demijohns prior to delivery either in person or courier.

FINALLY

All exhibits will be disposed of unless clearly specified otherwise by the exhibitor on their entry form.

Exhibits may be removed (subject to the approval of the Competition Steward) after 4pm on the last day of the Show.

Any exhibit not collected by 7pm on Saturday will become the property of the RCAA and disposed of.

REGULATIONS

1. The competition is open to all cider and apple juice makers using UK grown apples.
2. All UK cider entries must conform to HMRC notice 162 but hobbyists do not need to be registered
3. Each exhibitor may enter up to TWO entries per class.
4. Apple juice must not be carbonated or flavoured
5. Any exhibitor whose entries total £20 or more will be entitled to one exhibitor day ticket.
6. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits but the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
7. Exhibits may be collected from 4pm on Saturday. Any entries not collected by 7pm on Saturday 11th June will become the property of the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association and will be disposed of at their discretion.
8. The judges have the power to withhold a prize from any class through insufficient merit.
9. No exhibit may be tasted, or in any way interfered with, whilst on the Show bench by the exhibitor or any other person, unless accompanied by a Cider Championship Steward.
10. Privacy Policy

The Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association privacy policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, that you provide to us or that we may receive from others about you will be processed by us. It includes data that we hold electronically and in paper files.

Names, addresses and details of entries will be published in the catalogue of entries and passed to our printers, solely for the purpose of compiling the catalogue. Results information may be published (in printed form and online) and provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information relating to Exhibitors and their animals / exhibits may be provided to Department of Environment, Fisheries and Rural Affairs (DEFRA), Trading Standards, Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA), British Cattle Movement Service (BCMS), SAC, Breed Societies, County Councils, Veterinary Advisors and others who have regulatory access.

PRESENTATIONS

HEALTH & SAFETY

Exhibitors are reminded that they must conform to the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 (as amended); Dangerous Substances and Explosive Atmosphere Regulations 2002 (DSERA) and other relevant Health and Safety legislation. Exhibitors must also comply with the equalities Act (formerly The Disability and Discrimination Act); the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order Act 2005; the Health Act 2006 incorporating the Smokefree Legislation.

Smoking is prohibited in all buildings, marquees and similar structures. Environmental Health Officers and Trading Standards Officers will be in attendance at the Show and have the authority to take appropriate enforcement action.
